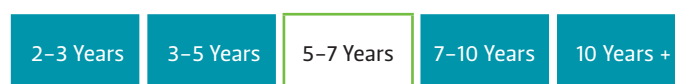

This is a multi-managed asset allocation fund that aims to produce returns of inflation plus 4-5%, net of fees, over a rolling 5 to 7-year time horizon.

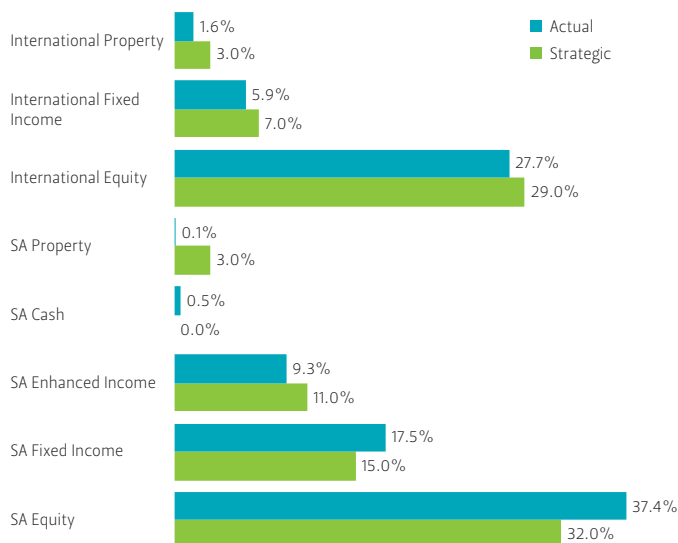
### Investment universe

The strategy mainly invests in domestic and international collective investment scheme funds and exchange traded funds with exposure to domestic and international equities, fixed income, property and cash.

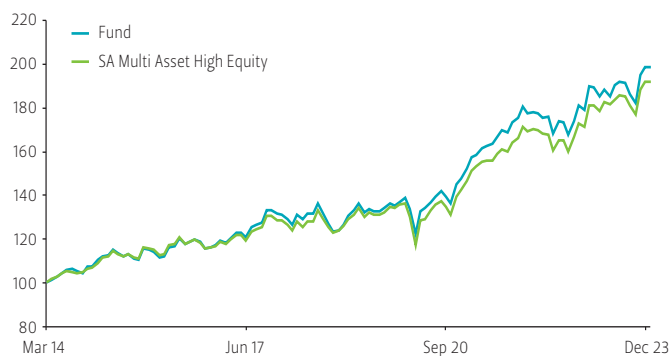

### Asset allocation

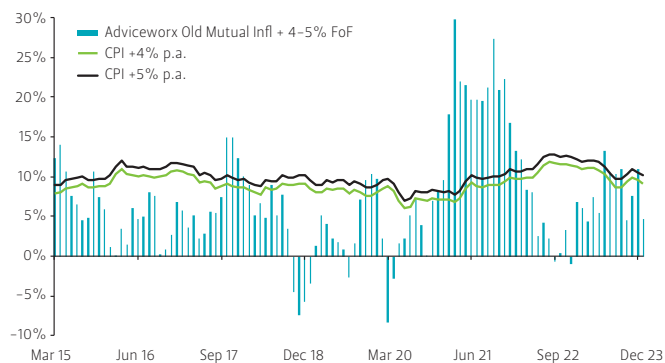


### Cumulative investment performance

**Fund Commentary**

South African equities did not follow global markets higher in January, with mining stocks coming under particular pressure. However, industrials and financials were also negative. The FTSE/JSE Capped SWIX lost 2.8% in the month. Over one year, the index is in the red at -2%.

Resources lost 6% in the month and 25% over one year. Industrials lost 1.4% in January but are positive over 12 months. Financials were also negative in the month, but well ahead of the other sectors over one year with a 12% return.

South African bonds were positive in January, with the JSE All Bond Index returning 0.7%. The one-year return of 7.3% lags cash (Stefi) at 8.2%. Inflation-linked bonds returned 0.1% in January and 8.2% over 12 months.

In contrast to local equities, JSE-listed property had another good month. The FTSE/JSE All Property Index (ALPI) returned 4.4% in January, and 16.5% over 12 months.

The rand was 2% weaker against the dollar in January, closing the month at R18.60. The 7% depreciation over 12 months boosted the returns of global assets from the point of view of South African investors.

Total expense ratio (TER) is a historical measure of the impact the deduction of management and operating costs have on a fund's value.
