INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE

The **Anchor BCI Bond Fund** seeks to achieve an investment medium for investors, with its main objective being the maximum total return by primarily investing in bonds.

INVESTMENT PHILOSOPHY

The investments normally to be included in the portfolio will comprise a combination of assets in liquid form and a combination of gilts and interest-bearing securities, including loan stock, semi-gilts, notes, debentures, debenture bonds, preference shares, money-market instruments, bonds, corporate debt, convertible equities and non-equity securities. The portfolio may, from time to time, invest in listed and unlisted financial instruments. The manager may also include forward currency, interest rate and exchange-rate swap transactions for efficient portfolio management purposes.


RISK PROFILE: LOW-MODERATE

Global risk appetite gained momentum throughout the month, with only a brief setback midmonth as conflict between Israel and Iran escalated and the US got involved, launching strikes on Iranian nuclear sites. Ultimately, the conflict de-escalated, and markets resumed their gains into month-end. Newswires were filled with headlines about several major US trade deals in the pipeline ahead of the 8 July reciprocal tariffs deadline, creating a supportive economic backdrop. At the same time, emerging signs of a softening US labour market and dovish commentary from some US Federal Reserve (Fed) officials contributed to a decline in US bond yields. The US Treasury curve slightly bull steepened over the month. The 2s30s spread remains above 100 bps - up from around 50 bps at the beginning of the year. Downward pressure is being exerted on short-dated yields as markets price in accelerating Fed rate cuts and anticipate the appointment of a dovish new Fed chair (current Fed Chair Jerome Powell has been the subject of intense criticism from US President Donald Trump despite being appointed by him). Meanwhile, long-dated yields remain somewhat elevated, held up by a jacked-up term premium and ongoing concerns around the tax and spending bill. On the domestic front, government bond yields continue to trend lower, as market participants continue to recalibrate inflation expectations lower following recent comments from National Treasury (NT) and the South African Reserve Bank (SARB) on lowering the inflation target. The breakeven curve shifted lower, with the 10-year point down by 30 bps. The SA government bond curve bull flattened over the month, with long-dated bond yields falling by 30 bps and the front-end yields declining by 20 bps. In the derivatives market, pricing suggests that the local policy rate may bottom at 6.75%. The fund's duration remains higher than the benchmark All Bond Index (ALBI). The fund's yield is higher than the ALBI's best possible yield (on a 10% holding width rule) for the fund's duration. The fund is strategically managed to secure an attractive return by investing primarily in a range of local fixed-rate government and corporate bonds.
