Investment Objective

The Bateleur Global Equity Prescient Feeder Fund aims to outperform global equity markets over the medium to long term. Its benchmark is the MSCI World Index.

Strategy

The fund is a feeder fund whose sole investment is the Ranmore Global Equity Fund Plc*, managed by Ranmore Fund Management Ltd. The Ranmore Global Equity Fund is an open-ended Irish UCITS with a 8 year track record. The Investment Manager utilises a fundamental, bottom up research process to identify investment opportunities. The fund will typically comprise of fewer than 40 investments at any time, primarily in large and mid-sized companies from a range of industry sectors.

Commentary from the Fund Manager of Ranmore Global Equity Fund Plc

Our more conservative investment approach meant the Fund fell less than the market in May. While markets fell sharply during the month, Fed Chair Powell's comments after month end has resulted (thus far) in a relief rally. Markets will always bounce around, but if you have an approach that takes care of the downside (real downside, not every minor dip), the upside should take care of itself. Warren Buffet said in an interview earlier this year, "you cannot get rich with a weather vane", thereby suggesting investors should avoid constantly changing direction based on the mood of others. They should plot a course and sail it. While drawdowns are never pleasant, they are unfortunately the short-term price one pays for being exposed to the inflation-beating returns the market has offered over the long term. And while the Value approach to investing has lagged Growth in recent years, what helps us stay the course is that it is a strategy underpinned by sound economics. Cheap assets by definition offer higher returns - if you pay £1m cash for a rental property and can rent it out for £50k a year, your return is 5% but if you paid £500k, your return is 10% p.a. When the cost of finance is below the yield on offer, value eventually gets unlocked. This is usually either through a competitor bidding for the company or the company itself launching a substantial buyback of its shares. Committing to pay higher dividends can also lead to a re-rating. The downside of this approach is that it requires patience while waiting for the potential catalysts to play out. We had to be patient with Celgene, but eventually a peer, Bristol Myers, bid for the company at a 30% premium. The alternative method of "investing" is to buy what other investors are buying now in the hope they will continue buying in the future, especially when you want to sell. But the downside is popular stocks provide very little margin of safety when things change. If for whatever reason there's a rush for the exists you can be faced with a permanent loss of capital. Even though Canada Goose (not a fund holding) grew revenue 25% last quarter, it has fallen 33% since 28th May. This is over concerns that the future earnings prospects aren't as expected. Yet it was a popular company and valued at 38 times earnings. Unfortunately, the free cash flow yield was only 0.3% (well below any cost of finance), the net cash of only \$50m could only buyback 1% of their shares so there was no margin of safety. When the weather vane shifted and the market no longer thought it was worth C\$7bn, shareholders faced what is most likely to be a permanent loss of capital. That's why we prefer the patient approach

Risk Guidance:

Low:

Generally low risk portfolios have minimal equity exposure or equity exposure, resulting in far less volatility than more aggressive mandated portfolio and in turn the probability of capital loss (permanent/temporary) is less likely.

Expected potential long term investment returns could be lower over the medium to long term

Moderate:

These portfolios generally hold more equity exposure than low risk portfolios but less than high risk portfolios.

In turn, the expected volatility is higher than low risk portfolios but less than high risk portfolios.

The probability of losses are higher than low risk portfolios, but less than high risk portfolios.

Expected potential long term investment returns could therefore be lower than high risk portfolios due to lower equity exposure, but higher than low risk portfolios.

High:

Generally these portfolios hold more equity exposure than any other risk profiled portfolios. These portfolios therefore tend to carry more volatility.

Expected potential long term returns could be higher than other risk profiles, in turn potential losses of capital could be higher.
