MONTHLY COMMENTARY

The SA Listed Property Index (SAPY) and the All Property Index (ALPI) recorded total returns of -8.59% and -8.80% respectively for the month of August, with the historic yield of the ALPI ending the month at 9.0%. The yield-to-maturity (YTM) on the Long-Term South African government bond (RLRS) weakened by 21bps ending the month at 9.49% (9.28% - 31 July 2020). The sector's performance in the month was dragged down by sector heavy weights Growthpoint (-8.13%), Redefine (-22.33%), Nepi Rockcastle (-10.90%) & Resilient (-10.76%) collectively making up circ 46% of the All Property Index by free float market capitalisation. The All Property Index (ALPI) continues to underperform other asset classes on a rolling 12-month period (-44.24%), with SA Cash outperforming with returns of (6.46%), followed by SA Bonds (4.18%) and SA Equities (3.85%).

We are currently in the middle of reporting season and given that most REITs would have provided some form of rental relief to tenants during lockdown, we forecast that like-for-like distributable income growth to be materially down for financial years ended 2020 relative to prior reporting periods. Our forecasted forward funds available for distribution (FAD) is 10.67%, but we are forecasting the short to medium-term impact of the hard lock-down on rent collections and solvency & liquidity position of companies to impact on how much funds get paid out as dividends. Off this low base we expect the sector's 4yr distributable income growth to be 4.7%, in-line with SA long term inflation. The sector's discount to net asset value at the end of the Aug'20 was 45% and our 5-year annualised nominal return forecasts for the sector ranges between 18% and 22%. This is underpinned by revised lower GDP and short-term inflation forecasts which has translated into lower market rental growth across most sub-sectors.

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




FUND TOP TEN AS AT 30 JUNE 2020 (ALPHABETICAL)
