The fund aims to achieve steady growth of capital and a higher return than the average general equity fund. It is managed using a proprietary quantitative investment process.

WHO IS THIS FUND FOR?

This fund is suited to investors with a long-term investment horizon seeking to maximise growth and who are able to accept the risks associated with equity funds.

INVESTMENT MANDATE

The fund invests in equities listed on the JSE Securities Exchange (JSE). Derivatives may be used for efficient portfolio management purposes.

REGULATION 28 COMPLIANCE

The fund aims to achieve long-term inflation-beating growth, and therefore may hold a higher allocation to equities than what is allowed in terms of Regulation 28 of the Pension Funds Act. This fund is therefore not Regulation 28 compliant.

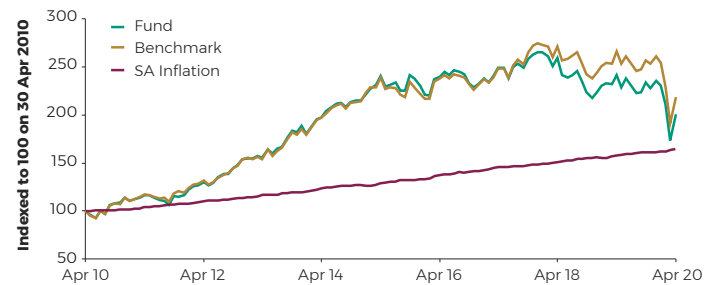

rebound in the second part of the year, 2020 will likely see a 2.5%-3% year-on-year contraction, which would represent the worst real-GDP contraction since World War II.

The speed of the decline in asset markets is also unprecedented. The US equity market entered a bear market in just 16 days, with the previous record of 44 days occurring in 1929. Volatility is breaking new records as well, with broad-market indices moving more than 9% in a single day on more than one occasion. Amidst this sell-off, we also saw an 18% three-day rally in US equities towards the end of March, the biggest such move since 1933. Despite the late rally, the quarter ended with the MSCI World Index (developed market proxy) down 21.1% in US dollar terms, and the S&P 500 Index down 19.6%.

With our economy vulnerable going into the crisis, the outcome for investors was never going to be a good one. In US dollar terms, SA equities experienced the worst quarterly performance of the last 45 years. The FTSE/JSE Capped All Share Index lost 37% in rand terms between 19 February and 23 March 2020. The losses amounted to 47% in US dollar terms, as the rand weakened by 27.4% over the quarter relative to the US dollar.

The FTSE/JSE Capped Shareholder Weighted Index (Capped SWIX) ended the first quarter

sharply down 26.6%. Financials were hurt the most, down 39.5%. Similarly, resources were down sharply by 18.5%. Industrials performed poorly but in relative terms significantly better than the other two sectors. Industrials were down 7.2%. Going down to share level, the spread between the shares with the highest returns and those with the worst returns was enormous. Durban Deep Gold had a positive return of 36.5% whereas Sasol was down 87.8%. This could result in large differences in returns between portfolios.

We continue to focus on constructing a portfolio enabled to outperform the Capped SWIX from the varying market themes. We strongly believe that it is the themes or factors that separate shares that outperform the Capped SWIX from those that underperform this index. It is through this investment belief and rigorous risk management that we are capable of achieving long-term capital growth. Prevalent sector tilts remain. The resources sector is preferred whereas property is unattractive. Medium-term momentum or sentiment and company profitability are attractive and our portfolio is positioned accordingly.

FUND COMMENTARY AS AT 31/03/2020

The global concern around the rapid spread of COVID-19 saw many countries struggling to contain the fatal effects of the virus, along with the associated economic impacts. The base case is a deep global recession in H1 2020, with recovery thereafter very much dependent on the virus peaking in the next two to three months.

With a massive interruption of global economic activity that is likely to stretch to at least the middle of the year, a decline of approximately 11% in global GDP is likely. Even after an anticipated sharp
