



PORTFOLIO MANAGERS COMMENTARY

FUTUREGROWTH ASSET MANAGEMENT

The US Federal Reserve (Fed) held two Federal Open Market Committee meetings in the second quarter of 2025. In the 7 May meeting, the Fed resolved to keep interest rates on hold citing uncertainty regarding trade tariffs imposed by the Trump administration, and possible inflationary impacts thereof. In the 18 June meeting, the Fed unanimously voted to keep the policy rate steady at 4.5%, marking the fourth consecutive pause. The Fed chair signalled no urgency to cut rates and said they are well-positioned to navigate the current uncertain environment, while still watching the impact of tariffs and the elevated risks to inflation and unemployment. The Fed also cited economic growth remaining **solid**, with labour market conditions strong and the unemployment rate low. Regarding balance sheet policy, the Fed signalled continued reduction in its holdings of treasuries and

agency mortgage-backed securities at the previously announced pace.

The South African Reserve Bank (SARB) monetary policy committee (MPC) met only once in the second guarter of 2025. In this 29 May meeting, the MPC resolved to cut the repurchase rate from 7.5% to 7.25%, with the vote being five members in favour of 25 basis points (bps) cut and one member in favour of a 50bps cut. Some of the key economic concerns highlighted in the speech included global headwinds - such as US trade tensions and weaker global growth weighing on South Africa's export sectors. The SARB also revised its 2025 inflation forecast downward - from 3.6% to 3.2% due to a firmer rand, lower global oil prices, and cancellation of Value-Added Tax increases, offsetting higher fuel levies. A key discourse in the second quarter of 2025 was the MPC modelling for a potential

3% inflation target, lower than the current midpoint (4.5%) of the 3-6% band. This scenario showed lower long-term rates, more stable inflation expectations, and sustainably lower interest rates.

The treasury bill and bank NCD curves remained stable to marginally flatter, with limited term premium for investing in the longer end of those curves. Short term funding requirements from local banks remain subdued, with oneyear Jibar-linked NCD's offered at 40bps above Jibar by the local big four banks.

The house view remains a shallow repurchase rate cutting cycle into year-end 2025, with two more interest rate cuts of 25bps priced into year-end due to headline inflation remaining low and stable. Portfolio interest rate risk positioning remains a marginal overweight to benchmark, with exposure to term credit remaining a key avenue for yield enhancement.
